Prayer – Foundation at Sandy Point, July 1893

Let us go back in time to Sandy Point, Bay St. George on Friday, July 28, 1893. The *SS Harlow*, carrying four Sisters of Mercy from Providence, Rhode Island has just docked at the wharf. Sisters Antonio Egan, Corsini Dempsey, Sylvester Carver and Veronica Payne make their way down the gangplank, accompanied by a friend, Mrs.Henrietta Brownell and Bishop Howley, Prefect Apostolic of Newfoundland's west coast. The people waiting on the dock are excited – there are loud shouts of welcome, evergreen arches, gunfire salvos and speeches. The August 12 account of the arrival in the *Evening Telegram* gives some idea of what that welcome was like:

The people displayed unbounded enthusiasm and interest in the arrival of the nuns and flocked around them in their own simple way as the harbingers of great future blessing to this place

Sit with this scene ...visualize it ... the crude huts, the sparse landscape, the muddy footpaths ...this was mission territory, far removed from the well-kept buildings, stately trees and green fields of Rhode Island. Let your thoughts and feelings surface ...

- What do you think these sisters might have been feeling excited? anxious? relieved? enthusiastic? fearful? hopeful?
- What would you like to say to them as they begin their mission?
